President Chapdelaine discussed his trip to Washington DC and his selection as the new head of the California Community College Chief Executive Officers Board. The president will focus on insuring the external community knows Trade Tech's leadership role in program innovation.

Dr. Gallagher Re-Elected

Dr. Mary Gallagher was unanimously re-elected as co-chair of the College Council for another two-year term.

Approved by College Council

- **Change the College Council Recommendation Form (CC).** It will now include a section where the initiator will be asked how the action supports student success.
- **Revise prioritization of Resource Requests (PBC).** Provide training on how to submit requests. Re-work the rubric on prioritizing requests.
- **Faculty Hires (PBC).** There are currently four fully-funded vacancies for this fiscal year. The college will hire eight full-time faculty members for the Spring semester.

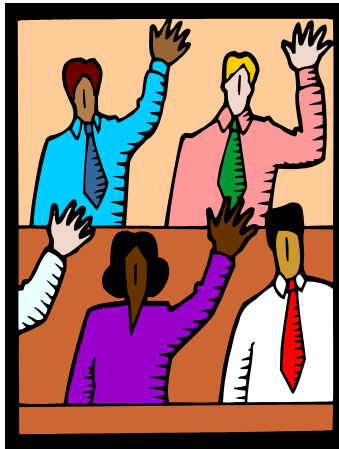
- **Allocation of District Reserve Funds**

- 1—Staff Development \$15,000
- 2—Lifeguards \$22,000
- 3--Student Success \$150,000
- 4—Prioritized Requests \$50,000
- 5—Reserve \$250,000

Student success plan suggested before disbursement.

- **Name Change (PBC).** The Annual Unit Plan will be changed to the Annual Plan so as not to confuse these plans with program review.
- **Name Change (TEC).** TEC is requesting a name change from MIS to IT to align itself with a commonly used term and the scope of work now performed by the department.
